the virtual meeting Females4Futures with the motto: "Let's Braid & Orange the World" invites to engage while weaving ties across hemispheres, sectors, and diverse roles to champion the cause of women empowerment through the dynamic realms of creative industries, the Orange Economy, and educational partnerships, particularly in STEAM that connects Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics), with feminist approach in the foreign policy and daily life activities.

Recognizing that violence against women is a manifestation of historically unequal power relations between women and men, which have led to domination over, and discrimination against, women by men and to the prevention of the full advancement of women and girls,

Recognizing the structural nature of violence against women as gender-based violence, and that violence against women is one of the crucial social mechanisms by which women are forced into a subordinate position compared with men, aspiring to create a world free from violence against women, we are tiding commitments towards ending violence against women through cross-sectoral international partnerships.

H.E. Olga Algayerová is a Slovak Diplomat and the former Executive Secretary of the United Nations Economic Forum for Europe (UNECE). Prior to her diplomatic career, she worked in the private sector as Corporate Export Manager at Zentiva International. From 2010 to 2012, she held the position of President of the Slovak Millennium Development Goals. From 2006 to 2010, she was State Secretary in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Before her appointment on 13 April 2017 by United Nations Secretary-General António Guterres, Olga Algayerová was the Permanent Representative of Slovakia to the International Organizations in Vienna. She is member of the International Gender Champions (IGC) network of female and male leaders of member states, international organizations, and civil society working for gender equality

Dancer, Choreographer, GRAVITY program Global Master Trainer, Yoga certified Teacher, Yamuna Teacher and Personal Trainer. Matilde Demarchi has studied art movement since the early 1970's.

Upon earning a scholarship from the European community in dance and theater in 1981, Demarchi founded "Arkè", dance school, study and choreographic research group. Demarchi remains the Director of "Arkè" to this day.

Beginning in 1981, Demarchi studied in New York at the "Martha Graham School of Contemporary Dance" and at the center of Robert Fitzgerald to deepen the knowledge of the Graham and Pilates technique, the connections and the application of the principles of "Pilates" in the physical preparation of the dancers. In the latest '80 She created the Arké Ensemble, a group of selected dancers from the school. Ms Demarchi created choreographies for over 40 years performed in Turin and around Europe.

She has been in Italy the first to reconstruct masterpieces repertoire from the XXth century American Modern Dance Pioneers. In 2006, the Martha Graham Center licensed the Arkè Ensemble directed by Kim Jones to perform Martha Graham's "Steps in the Street". Ms Demarchi performed the soloist role. In 2006 Demarchi earned a degree in "Scienze Tersicoree" with the thesis "Psycho-physical and technical preparation of the dancer: training disciplines of the twentieth century." In 2008 she completed her training at the Doris Humphrey Foundation in Oak Park, Illinois, thereafter receiving the appointment of Country Manager for the technique in Italy.

Since 2005 Demarchi has been a GRAVITY Global International Master Trainer for Total Gym teaching in Italy, U.S.A ,Holland, Bulgaria, Denmark ,China, Russia, South Africa, Kuwait, Dubai,Oman,Singapore, Czech Republic, Mexico., India, Korea, Malaysia Japan, Grecia, England.

Demarchi is the Creator and Developer of the method "19HUNDRED PILATES AND DANCE." and Matilde's Braid.

Matilde's Braid, the new frontier of elastic resistance training, is a small tool inspired by the creative power of the body in movement. It was created with f an idea and an instinct deeply linked to passion for quality physical activity.

Elke Freytag is a women fashion designer.

Her fashion is inspired by designers of the 60s, such as Mary Quant.

As a trained construction technician and career changer in the fashion world, Elke Freytag's designs are characterized by simple cuts and striking patterns. Her statement pieces are used in a pointed way and are always part of the current collection. The designs look depending on accessories and shoes, sometimes sporty or elegant and can be worn all day.

Sustainability plays an important role in the designer's fashion image. Thus, all pattern pieces and prototypes are constructed and sewn in the atelier. Elke Freytag designs are created in the in-house studio and in selected sewing shops in Vienna and the surrounding area. 

"Vivre sans fuir" ("Living without fleeing") combines an important theme, interculturality, with art. This video clip carried by young volunteers from the Belgian Red Cross is a beautiful creative example of a fusion between migration, music and poetry. This project is, above all, human. The lyrics of the clip tell true stories. We discover migration from 4 points of view: that of a child, an Unaccompanied Foreign Minor, an isolated woman and a father. The people featured are themselves migrants. The two singers, Sarah and Arnaud, are also involved in the project. Sarah, a CRB volunteer, wrote the lyrics and imagined the music video. Arnaud, composer and video maker, set these words to music and brought them to life through video.

The clip reminds us that we are all human. We dream. It doesn't matter where we come from, what we experience. Despite sometimes very difficult situations, the hope of a better future gives the courage to move forward.
